Edina Country Club Area Residents:

Please disregard the City Extra email that was sent to you on Friday, October 31. This is your regular weekly update for October 31.

Safety:

Street lights will **not** be turned back on in time for Halloween on the following streets.

1. All Stage 5 streets
2. Stage 6: Edgebrook Place

Please be careful driving or walking along these streets at nights, but especially on Halloween night.

Cured-in-Place-Pipe (CIPP) Sanitary and Storm Sewer Trunk Pipe Reconstruction:

During the week of October 27, Palda resumed their work on this item in the 2009 project area. In particular they installed a CIPP liner in a storm sewer trunk pipe in Stage 10 west of Bruce Avenue.

On an intermittent schedule, this work will continue during fall/winter 2008 on the storm and sanitary sewer trunk pipes shown in the progress map for the period November 3 – November 16.

If the progress map for the period November 3 – November 16 shows that CIPP work will occur along the trunk sanitary sewer pipe in front of your home, please recall that this work will temporarily block the flow from your house to the trunk sanitary sewer pipe. Palda will use a doorknob hanger to notify you of the actual date and time the blockage will begin. The doorknob hanger will also list emergency contact information if you encounter difficulties during your particular blockage.

Streets, Sidewalks, Driveways, and Boulevards:

**Crack Control Joints Coming to Streets in Stages 1 – 5 and Stage 6
Edgebrook Place:**

During a few days in mid-November, Palda will use large saws to cut these joints into the recently installed final layer of blacktop pavement on these streets. The saws resemble garden tractors. They **will** create dust when they operate. Please be patient with the dust. The sawing will not take very long to complete.

After the joint is cut, it is backfilled with flexible joint filler. The joints control where cracks form in the new pavement. All blacktop pavement in cold-weather climates, such as the Country Club's, crack when they endure freeze-thaw cycles in the weather.

Palda will inform you in advance of the actual day they will saw the joints into the pavement in front of your house using a door knob hanger. On that day, you must **not** park on your street. Otherwise, you will be in Palda's way. Palda will also post temporary no parking signs on that day on your particular street.

Palda **will** ask the Police department to have any vehicle violating not just this, but any temporary parking restriction in the Country Club, ticketed and towed

Second Layer of Blacktop Pavement along Country Club Road east of Casco Avenue in Stages 8 and 10:

Please recall that the October 24 edition of the City Extra reported that Palda asked the City for permission to not install the second layer of blacktop pavement on this particular street segment in 2008, but instead wait until 2009 because 2009 reconstruction traffic could damage the pavement. The City agreed and gave Palda permission.

Any damage to this street segment and its adjacent concrete curb and gutter caused by not installing the final layer of pavement, especially from snow plows, will be repaired before Palda installs the pavement in 2009.

Brick Paver Crosswalks:

Please recall that the June 27 edition of the City Extra reported that to quicken Palda's reconstruction schedule, the City gave Palda permission to construct all of the crosswalks in 2009. As has already been done in Stages 1 – 4, Palda will install the final layer of blacktop street pavement across the site of all of the proposed crosswalks in Stages 5 – 10 as well. In late 2009, near the end of the entire project, Palda will remove just enough of the blacktop to install the crosswalks.

On-Street Parking:

In Stage 5, Edgebrook Place in 6 and Country Club Road east of Casco Avenue in Stages 8 and 10, on-street parking is not being allowed between 7 am to 9 pm, Monday through Saturday. Please contact your guests and contractors to inform them that they cannot park on the street during these hours. The parking ban remains in effect on Bridge Street east of Browndale Avenue .

Please remember that if you park your car in the street, State Statute requires that you park no closer than 5-feet from the edges of any driveway.

Who to Contact in an Emergency:

During a life or property-threatening emergency, call 911. If construction equipment or materials need to be moved as part of dealing with the emergency, 911 has a list of emergency contacts for Palda.
